I do hope that you and your family have a wonderful holiday weekend planned. Even though the weather doesn't feel like spring, Herron High School is entering its spring testing season.


We started the NWEA testing for our ninth and tenth graders this past week. That testing will continue next week as well. Monday, May 2, 2011 begins our Advanced Placement Testing. As teachers and administrators, we appreciate the feedback that the NWEA test gives us; it measures student academic growth. The AP tests run through Friday, May 13, 2011. We will have a record number of students sitting for AP exams this year.

After the AP exams end, we will begin the End of Course Exams (E.C.A.'s). These tests are replacing the ISTEP+ exams that were once required. In order for students to receive a high school diploma, students must pass the E.C.A.'s for English and Math during the spring of their sophomore year.

The state is also piloting the Biology E.C.A. and we are required to give our students who are currently enrolled in biology that test as well.

Please help us make the month of May a productive one for our students. The students should eat a good breakfast and get at least eight hours of sleep each night. Good nutrition and proper rest are two of the best test preparations students can have.

## **NGs, MANDATORY STUDY HALL AND SATURDAY SCHOOL:**

### **WHAT'S OUR POLICY AND HOW DOES IT ALL WORK?**

Every Wednesday at noon a report is generated and given to the administrators. This report lists the names of all students who have NGs at that time, as well as the number of NGs each student has. Before dismissal on Wednesday the "NG List" is posted and all students are required to check to see if their name is on the list.

*Any student who has one or more NGs when the report is generated must serve that number of Mandatory Study Hall hours before the start of school the following*

*Wednesday.* For example, if a student has NGs in Latin II, Geometry and Drawing on Wednesday, they must attend three hours of Mandatory Study Hall before the next Wednesday *even if they change their grade and get rid of their NGs before the next Wednesday!*

Also, a student MUST be on time to the Mandatory Study Hall and stay for the complete 50 minutes or they will not receive credit for attending it.

If a student fails to attend the required number of Mandatory Study Hall hours during the week, they will be assigned to Saturday School.

We have been explaining this policy daily to the students since November, but please work with us to help your child understand this policy, remind them to check the NG list on Wednesday, and remind them to attend Mandatory Study Hall.

Your help is greatly appreciated.

Read below for an explanation of NGs, MSHs, and Saturday Schools or check out the Herron HS Student Handbook!

What is an NG? An NG stands for No Grade. Herron does not pass students on any grade less than a 70% (C-). Instead, students receive an NG. A complete explanation is found in the HHS Student Handbook.

What is MSH? MSH stands for Mandatory Study Hall and is an approach similar to professors' office hours at colleges and universities. Every day (Monday through Thursday) before and after school, every department has a teacher ready and available to help your child. MSH hours are: 8:00-8:50 a.m. and 4:10-5:00 p.m.

What is Saturday School? Saturday School is a time for students to catch up on their school work, get help from teachers and raise their grades. Herron High School holds Saturday School sessions one or two times a month on Saturday morning, 7:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

## **Academic Eligibility:**

**Rule 18 of IHSAA requires a student to receive a passing grade and earn credit on their most recent Grade Report in at least 70% of the maximum number of full credit subjects that a student can take in order to be eligible to participate in the athletic program.**

In order to remain a member of IHSAA, Herron High School must implement IHSAA academic eligibility rules **as a minimum**. The policy at Herron High School is that students take 7 full credit subjects and 1 seminar:

**70% of 7 classes = 5 classes**

In particular, Achaean athletes must consistently maintain a passing grade in all core subjects; English, Math, Science, Social Studies and Latin.

### **\*Academic Probation:**

Any student that passes at least 5 of their classes is academically eligible by IHSAA rules. However, if a student passes at least 5 of their classes but has an NG in any of their core subjects (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Latin), they will be placed on “Academic Probation”. Students on Academic Probation are required to attend their MSH. Students who are able to remediate the NG to a passing grade during the 4 week window of remediation are no longer on Academic Probation. Students who are not able to remediate the grade are deemed academically ineligible.

Students in need of improvement have many opportunities for academic help. Students with an NG in one or more classes will be required to attend a mandatory study hall in the hour before or after school. Peer tutoring can also be arranged, and many teachers offer afterschool assistance as well. Students will be allowed to return to a sports program when his/her most recent report card reflects the minimum standards.
